INTERNET POLICY

- 1. The school's Internet connection exists to provide access to curriculum related information. Permission is required to search outside curricula needs.
- 2. Information published on the Internet may be inaccurate or may misrepresent a person or situation. Persons using the Internet must take care in using this information.
- 3. This school does not permit searches for material of a pornographic or extremely violent nature. Should a user inadvertently come across any such material they must immediately back out of that page, must not save any such data and they must advise a teacher.
- 4. Copyright law must be respected at all times. This means that users may NOT copy or redistribute another person's work. Users wanting to utilise other people's work for educational purposes must acknowledge the source of the work and the owner.
- 5. Section 85ZE of the Commonwealth Crimes Act States that a person shall not knowingly or recklessly;
 - -Use a telecommunication service supplied by a carrier to menace or harass another person -Use a telecommunication service supplied by a carrier in such a way as would be regarded by reasonable persons as being, in all circumstances, offensive
- 6. Students are restricted to using World Wide Web or Dingo Mail for school purposes only, *ie.* not for personal use
- 7. One person at a time may occupy a computer, unless specifically told otherwise by a teacher.
- 8. Under no circumstances are private disks or flash drives to be used in school computers, including floppy disks or CD's and no program's are to be installed on school computers.
- 9. Printouts of information retrieved for curriculum purposes are allowed free of charge on the expectation that all users will carefully monitor their printouts to avoid long articles or unnecessary information.
- 10. Always leave the computers as you found them. Do not turn computers off unless instructed to do so by a supervising teacher.
- 11. Report any problems immediately to a supervising teacher.
- 12. All students are to be given equal opportunity in accessing the Internet.
